- Inclusion







Methods

- Making Waves in Equitable Coastal Resilience: A National Workshop on Social Equity and Coastal Resilience
 - Discussion questions included resources, data, and policy changes needed to address equity in emergency management
 - Sample: two breakout sessions focused on emergency and disaster management challenges
 - 25 participants

- November 2022
- Virtual format
- Three-day workshop
- Participants: academics, researchers, practitioners, and community members
- Total # of participants: 113
- 50-min breakout sessions



FINDINGS

- Focus on long-term recovery
- Workforce diversity
- Focus on equity in the provision of resources and funding
- Whole-of-community approach
- Resilience and process literacy
