

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

Conductor, violinist, composer, and educator **Paul S. Kim** is an Assistant Professor of Music at Old Dominion University, where he directs the ODU Symphony Orchestra, teaches applied violin and conducting, and oversees the string and chamber music programs. He also serves as the Assistant Conductor of the Richmond Philharmonic Orchestra. Previously, he served as Assistant Conductor and Principal Second Violinist of the Piedmont Symphony Orchestra, and he has enjoyed guest-conducting performances with the Roanoke Symphony, Waynesboro Symphony, and the Charlottesville & University Symphony Orchestras. On the popular side, Dr. Kim was the conductor for Eurythmics star Dave Stewart and his Rock Fabulous Orchestra. As a violinist, he is a current member of the Roanoke Symphony Orchestra and a past member of the Fairfax Symphony Orchestra and the McLean Orchestra.

Dr. Kim is also the composer of over twenty original works. His arrangements of Radiohead songs for string quintet SYBARITE5 have been performed on NPR's Performance Today as well as at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, and the Aspen Music Festival. The arrangements have been released on SYBARITE5's album Everything in Its Right Place.

Dr. Kim holds a D.M.A. degree in Conducting Performance from Shenandoah Conservatory as well as master's degrees in music from the University of Maryland and the University of Virginia. He also formerly served as a Sergeant in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

Dr. Nancy K. Klein, director, is a native of Virginia, receiving her early education in Fairfax County. She earned the B.S. in Music Education from the University of Richmond (cum laude), the M.M.E in Vocal Performance from ECU (honors) and the Ph.D. in Music from NYU (valedictorian). Dr. Klein has studied conducting with Eric Ericson, Robert Shaw, John deRevere and James Erb. She has performed in Alice Tully Hall, Rockefeller Center, Carnegie Hall, Town Hall and the National Arts Club in New York City. She was recently featured in Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center, conducting Mozart's *Vesperae Solennes de confessore*, KV 339. She has been the featured conductor throughout Europe for four seasons with the Sound of America Honor Choir, performing in Notre Dame Cathedral, St. Mark's Basilica and Concert Halls in six countries. Dr. Klein is much sought after as a guest conductor and vocal clinician.

She is recognized nationally as "Who's Who in America," "Who's Who of America's Teachers," and "Who's Who in Entertainment," and has been awarded the Joel Lewis Faculty Award for Excellence in Mentoring, the Robert L. Stern Award for Excellence in Teaching and the University Professor distinction. Dr. Klein is currently Graduate Program Director and Director of Choirs in the Department of Music at Old Dominion University.

Suzanne Wolvin, Assistant Director, completed her Bachelor of Arts in Music in August of 2012 and is currently serving as Graduate Assistant for Choral Music in the Master of Music Education (MME) degree program. She has conducted the ODU Men's Choir, Diehn Chorale, Concert Choir, soloed with the Jazz Choir, and served as *repetiteur* for Opera Workshop.
