

Professor John Toomey has served as chair of the Department of Music for the past five years. He has been recognized for excellence in teaching several times, including his designation as University Professor for Excellence in Teaching, an honorary title awarded to less than 2 percent of the faculty at the university. Other honors include TELETECHNET Professor of the Year, and winner of the SCHEV Award for Excellence in Teaching. Professor Toomey teaches a graduate section of The History and Aesthetics of Jazz every summer via TELETECHNET, and also oversees and directs graduate students in two performing ensembles, Jazz Choir and Jazz Ensemble.

In the area of research, Professor Toomey serves as both director and performer for the Attucks Jazz Series under the umbrella of the Virginia Arts Festival, performs twice a year on the Diehn Concert Series with various jazz artists, and serves as performer and Music Director for Havana Nights, a state of the art jazz club in the Tidewater region. In all of these venues, he is performing in concert with nationally and internationally acclaimed jazz artists, such as Tierney Sutton, John Fedchock, Joe Locke, Terrell Stafford, and others. In addition, Professor Toomey has given performances and clinics for The Duffy Composers Institute and the University of Miami. The original score he composed for The Boys of H Company was recently aired in Singapore and Japan, and was featured on national television dozens of times during the past few years. Professor Toomey's arrangement of Dance With Me for jazz choir was selected by Kim Nazarian of the New York Voices for use with the Pennsylvania All State Jazz Choir Festival, and his arrangement of Sugar was performed by the top jazz vocal ensemble at the University of Miami.

Professor Keith Philbrick is an active woodwind performer and educator in the Tidewater area of Virginia. He is a featured member of the group "Skylark" and the Roy Muth Big Band and performs regularly with the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, Broadway at Chrysler Hall, Virginia Musical Theater and with many national touring artists. Additionally, Keith holds teaching positions at Elizabeth City State University and the Governor's School for the Arts. A retired First Sergeant, he served twenty-six years in U.S. Army Bands as a leader, performer, and instructor including tours at the Navy School of Music, the U.S. Continental Army Band, the NATO Band, and the U.S. Army Europe Band. Keith is a graduate of Oral Roberts University, the Armed Forces School of Music, and Old Dominion University.
