Morgan N. Hatfield is an undergraduate music composition student at Old Dominion University. He has been a student of Dr. Adolphus Hailstork since 2010. He is a recipient of the F. Ludwig Diehn music scholarship. In 2011, he was selected as a finalist in the Young Artist Competition at Old Dominion University for his concert band fanfare “Jubilation” (2011). After this, he submitted “Jubilation” to the National Band Association/ Merrill Jones Memorial Young Composer Band Composition Contest in 2012, and the piece was chosen to be considered for the final round of the competition. His other works include: “The Capricious Sprite,” for clarinet and piano (2012); “Deliver Me,” for tenor and piano; an arrangement of M. Leontivich’s “Ukrainian Bell Carol” for concert band (2011); and “Ordo quod chaos fio unus,” for brass choir (2010)—all of which have been premiered at Old Dominion University. He will be graduating from Old Dominion University in December 2013. After graduating, he plans to stay at ODU to pursue a Master’s of Music Education, with an emphasis on instrumental conducting.

Flutist Dylan M. Keefe was born in 1994 in Norfolk, VA and attended Great Hope Baptist School in Chesapeake, VA from kindergarten through the twelfth grade. Introduced to the flute at the age of 9 by his parents, Dylan began taking private lessons with Ms. Bonnie Kim at the Academy of Music in Norfolk, and continues to study with her today. He was a member of Bay Youth Symphony Orchestras of Virginia for four years, beginning in 2008. Dylan has won multiple awards for his playing, including two first places in the 2011 and 2012 Annual Hampton Roads Flute Faire, and third place in the ODACS National competition in Greenville, SC.

Jeffrey Phelps is the Instrumental Music Division Chair at the Governor's School for the Arts, and is currently in his seventh season as its Orchestra Director. He is also recipient of the 2011 SURDNA Arts Teachers Fellowship and three Foundation Thyll-Dürr grants. A graduate of the Governor’s School for the Arts and the Cleveland Institute of Music, Jeff has conducted the Virginia Symphony and the Williamsburg Youth Orchestra. Jeff is the cellist of the Alborada Piano Trio, and has performed in the sections of many orchestras including the Virginia Symphony. In 2010, Jeff also joined the faculty of Chamber Music of the Rockies. Jeff is honored to have served as the conductor of the Old Dominion University Symphony Orchestra this season and wishes all the best to its passionate and dedicated members.
