Under his direction. The Old Dominion University Wind Ensemble has developed into a premiere performing ensemble and has received critical acclaim for performances of works of Colgrass, Ring, Sochinski, Camphouse, Hailstork, Smith and Erickson. They have recorded for TRN Music Publishers and Frank Erickson Publications. The ODU Wind Ensemble has been featured at the Virginia Music Educators Association In-Service Conference, the College Band Directors National Association Southern Division Conference and most recently in Carnegie Hall and the Kennedy Center. As former Chair, he guided the steady growth of the Old Dominion University Music Department at the undergraduate and graduate level. Professor Zeisler has a B.M., B.M.E., and M.M. from the University of Michigan, where he was solo clarinetist of the Symphony Band under the direction of Dr. William D. Revelli.
