Frank C. Garcia, a native of Durango, Colorado is Chair of the Visual and Performing Arts Academy and Arts Department at Salem High School in Virginia Beach, Virginia where he also serves as lead teacher. Mr. Garcia is a graduate of Old Dominion University where he was a saxophone student of Dennis Zeisler. Following his studies at Old Dominion University, Mr. Garcia did advanced work at the Bordeaux Conservatory in France, where he was a student of Jean Marie Londeix. Mr. Garcia's ensembles have appeared at the FedEx Orange Bowl, The Indy 500 Parade and Race, Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center and at Lincoln Center. Mr. Garcia has been on the staff at the National Music Camp at Interlochen and on the faculties of Old Dominion University, Tidewater Community College and Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp. Mr. Garcia performs regularly as a member of the Virginia Wind Symphony and was a member of the Virginia Saxophone Quartet and L'Ensemble International d 'Saxophone. Mr. Garcia's special training includes the Jazz at Lincoln Center National Band Directors institute with Wynton Marsalis, L'Centre d'Arts d'Orford, Quebec, Canada and the National Music Camp at Interlochen. Mr. Garcia has been Teacher of the Year at multiple schools including Salem High School and has been designated a VBCPS "Distinguished Educator". Mr. Garcia is a "Nobel Educator of Distinction" and is listed in Who's Who Among American Teachers", Who's Who in America and has been awarded the prestigious "ALLI" Award by the Cultural Alliance of Greater Hampton Roads for his significant contributions to cultural arts. Mr. Garcia is a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia and was recently awarded an alumni service award. Mr. Garcia has served on the Board of Directors of the Bay Youth Orchestras of Virginia, as District Instrumental Representative for the Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association and as District Chairman for the Virginia Music Educators Association. Mr. Garcia resides in Norfolk, Virginia with his wife Sharon.

Conductor, composer, and violinist **Paul S. Kim** is an assistant professor at Old Dominion University, where he directs the ODU Symphony Orchestra, teaches conducting and violin, and oversees the strings program. He is also music director of the Orchestra of the Eastern Shore and the symphony orchestra conductor of the Fine Arts Camps Europe/ Czech Music Camp for Youth. Kim was previously assistant conductor of the Richmond Philharmonic and the Piedmont Symphony Orchestra, and he appeared on ABC's The View as the conductor for Eurythmics star Dave Stewart and his Rock Fabulous Orchestra. A scholar of the music of Carl Roskott, Kim is the conductor and producer for a recording of Roskott's Concerto for Violin Solo and Orchestra and his Sonata for Violin and Piano under the Centaur Records label. Kim is also the composer of over twenty original works. Where Darkness Meets Light, a multimedia composition for violin and cello, was performed at the Chrysler Museum of Art and at the 2017 Glass Art Society Conference to critical acclaim. His arrangements of Radiohead songs for string quintet SYBARITE5 have been performed on NPR's Performance Today as well as at Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center and have been released on SYBARITE5's album Everything in Its Right Place. As a violinist, Kim is a member of the Roanoke Symphony and has performed with the Virginia Symphony and Maryland Symphony as well as internationally. He and his wife Rebecca are co-founders of New Music Norfolk, performing and promoting new art music for Norfolk and surrounding communities. Dr. Kim completed a D.M.A. in conducting at Shenandoah Conservatory. Previously, he earned an M.M. in orchestral conducting at the University of Maryland as well as an M.A. in music and a B.S. in chemistry at the University of Virginia. Kim also served as a sergeant in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.
