Professor Larry Jay Giddens, Baritone, is an integral part of the Diehn School of Music (DSoM) as a sought after studio voice teacher. He is making his directing debut for DSoM serving as the Director of Opera Theatre Workshop. A native of the Eastern Shore of Virginia, he is passionate about creating meaningful artistic experiences in the performing arts. Mr. Giddens has been

seen world-wide performing in Europe, Russia, Australia, and New Zealand in the roles of Crown and Jake in *Porgy and Bess. His other roles include La Traviata (Germont, Baron Douphol), Faust (Valentin), Fidelio (Don Fernando), Carmen (Morales), Così fan tutte (Don Alfonso) Don Giovanni (Don Giovanni), La Bo-*

hème (Marcello), Gallantry (Dr. Gregg), and Dido and Aeneas (Aeneas). Currently, Mr. Giddens is a resident of Virginia Beach, VA, where he, his wife, and four children have been embraced by the local community. When he is not fully immersed in the arts, he can be found cheering on his children as they compete in local, regional, and national sports competition. He also writes poetry and short stories and does freelance graphic design in his spare time.

Director's Notes by Larry Jay Giddens

Most people know me as an opera singer or maybe even an arts administrator in the Hampton Roads community. Director is not a title that comes to mind as easily as the other two. But directing is something that's always been of interest to me. From school plays in elementary school with my sixth grade history teacher to campfire skits from the age of eight in Alderson, WV, I've always had an affinity for the stage. When given the opportunity to work on Gian Carlo Menotti's The Old Maid and the Thief, I didn't hesitate.

This show poses unique challenges for a director as it was written in the 1930's originally as a radio satire of American Suburbia. Menotti found that what seemed to be quaint, cute towns actually covered up a plethora of secrets about people and places. The work, commissioned by NBC, premiered in 1939.

When approaching this opera, I wanted to see how much I could distance the piece from the traditional presentational setting of utilizing a narrator to announce the fourteen scenes listed in the program. It was my goal to create one seamless show. Although there are moments of blackouts through lighting, I feel that it has been achieved in this production.

This one act opera allows the viewer to fall in love with the character or characters of their choice. Each student artist has worked hard to build relationships between their

She loves working on shows, with her most recent credits being rehearsal conductor for this production of The Old Maid and the Thief, and Rodgers and Hammerstein's Cinderella, for which she earned a Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival nomination for Vocal Coaching. Cristina holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Choral Music Education and will achieve her Masters of Music Education this coming May. She is also a licensed PK-12 music educator who most recently taught for Virginia Beach City Public schools, and plans on pursuing her Doctor of Musical Arts degree once her masters degree is complete.
